

ARMENIAN BAR ASSOCIATION 2008 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM APPLICATION

The Armenian Bar Association (ArmenBar) is pleased to award scholarships to selected recipients who are or will be students at an accredited or approved law school seeking a law degree (such as a J.D. or an L.L.M.). Additional information regarding the ArmenBar scholarship program is included with this application package.

TO BE CONSIDERED FOR AN ARMENBAR SCHOLARSHIP, YOU MUST:

1. At the time of submitting the scholarship application, be enrolled in or admitted to, if in the United States, an American Bar Association-accredited or state-accredited law school, or if in Armenia or another country, a law school approved by ArmenBar. See Paragraph #3E below. If you do not know if your law school is an approved law school, please contact ArmenBar by e-mail (info@armenianbar.org) with your question.
2. Have strong academic potential as demonstrated by your academic performance (i.e., grades).
3. Complete and return by the application deadline the enclosed application package with all of the required information and documents. The application package must include the following:
 - A. Completed application form;
 - B. Personal essay (as required in the application form);
 - C. Two letters of recommendation (from professors, school administrators, Armenian community leaders, or others in official capacities who have knowledge of your academic performance and potential and/or your commitment to the Armenian community);
 - D. Official grade transcripts from undergraduate college and law school (if you have completed at least one year of law school); and
 - E. Proof of entrance or acceptance into, or continuation in, an approved law school. If you cannot submit such proof by the application deadline, you may still submit an application but the selection of every award recipient will be conditioned upon the satisfactory submission of the required proof.

If you meet these requirements, the ArmenBar Grants Committee will consider your application for an ArmenBar Scholarship. If the Grants Committee selects you as a finalist, you may be contacted for a personal interview and you may be asked to provide more information or documents. **Please note that failure to deliver any one of the required documents will automatically disqualify you from the scholarship program, and ArmenBar will not accept any submissions after the deadline indicated below.**

Please note that the scholarship recipients will be chosen on the basis of their academic performance, leadership qualities and the quality of their contribution to or involvement with issues concerning Armenians, and NOT on the basis of their financial need.
2. Two letters of recommendation (from professors, school administrators, Armenian community leaders, or others in official capacities who have knowledge of your academic performance and potential and/or your commitment to the Armenian community) and have them sent directly to the ArmenBar Grants Committee.
3. Official grade transcripts from undergraduate college and law school (if you have completed at least one year of law school).
4. Proof of entrance or acceptance into, or continuation in, an approved law school. If you cannot submit such proof by the application deadline, you may still submit an application but the selection of every award recipient will be conditioned upon the satisfactory submission of the required proof.
